



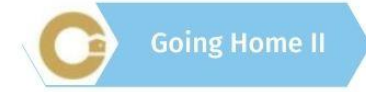

- Touch as many young people as possible so they choose a life of love rather than violence.

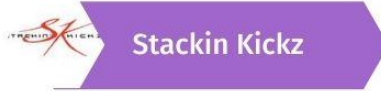
